A NEW APPROACH TO INSTRUCTION

In recent years, 65-75 percent of St. Peter's student body has tested as English Language Learners (ELLs). With our current students, many are heritage Spanishspeakers who speak Spanish at home. Children are tested in English when applying for enrollment, though they often struggle because instruction is not delivered in their first language. The fact that many students are not grasping academic concepts becomes most noticeable in 3rd grade as children transition from "learning to read" to "reading to learn."




LONG LASTING LEGACIES

St. Peter's Legacy

While working on St. Peter's Archival materials, volunteer and former student Bob Noakes found his baptismal certificate from 1950. Bob, a member of the extended Mitchell family, has been uncovering some exciting pieces of the School's history, such as this photograph from March 1948 when the President of Ireland, Eamon De Valera, attended Palm Sunday Mass at St. Peter's Church. Bob identified his uncle, John Waters, in the crowd.

Carl Nolte '51 added: "The priest is Father Ralph Hunt, and I can see Jim Gould in the front row as well as a boy whose last name was Mayorga, Humberto Bermudez, and Jerry Valencia. De Valera was the last survivor of Ireland's 1916 Easter Rising leadership. He was prime minister and president of Ireland and a great friend of San Francisco's Father Peter Yorke."

STUDENT DEVELOPMENT

A NEW APPROACH TO INSTRUCTION (CONTINUED)

In 2021, the School's leadership team learned about the successes of Catholic elementary schools while working with Boston College's Two-Way Immersion Network for Catholic Schools (TWIN-CS). Research shows that delivering academic information in two languages (such as Spanish and English) allows students to grasp content better and supports their social-emotional development. At the same time, students will experience that their "whole" person, including their language and culture, is valued-which is an important part of the mission of St. Peter's School. Ultimately, students will become fully bilingual and bi-literate and can carry those capabilities throughout their lives. Additionally, during feasibility study data collection for the implementation of Dual Language Immersion, it was discovered that within SFUSD, there are far more requests for assignments to DLI classrooms than available spots. Clearly, there is a demand and a desire for dual-language academic instruction, and St. Peter's School is working to meet this need for the community.

We'll keep you informed as we prepare to open San Francisco's first Catholic Dual Language Immersion Program, beginning with the Kindergarten class of 2024-2025.
